Winter School 2024 - Water Management and Food Security

Program outline

The objective of the Winter School is to introduce important topics concerning the sustainable use and management of water resources under existing and emerging constraints, current situations in agricultural water management and crop production, food quality, and the value chain. All the topics will be supported by case studies and real-world examples in Vietnam.

The program will provide wonderful opportunities for field trips, hands-on activities, and discussions with local stakeholders. The participants will be able to join group discussions to identify the current issues pertaining to water management and food security, as well as to draft innovative initiatives for sustainable supply of clean water and safe foods.

The program will be conducted in English, allowing you to freely practice English with international students, learn about new cultures, and make new friends.

Dates and location

The Winter School will be held from February 25 to March 2, 2024 at the Vietnam National University of Agriculture (VNUA) in Hanoi, Vietnam.

Who can apply

Applicants should be enthusiastic, inquisitive, and eager to explore new culture in foreign countries, participate in English communication and the study topics.

We will select 10 participants for this program.

Expenses

The estimated expenses are as follows:

- International airfare from Tokyo to Hanoi: 50,000 – 100,000 JPY
- Accommodation: 20,000 – 30,000 JPY
- Meals: ~1000 JPY/day

The international airfare and accommodation costs will be covered up to 100,000 JPY, and students will be responsible for the remainder. Students are responsible for their daily personal costs not covered by the program, such as food, local travels, etc.
